We then took our seats surrounding the court room action. 'Witness for the Prosecution' began very dramatically, encouraging the audience to question the use of the death penalty. The play then unfolded with an actual jury presiding over the court case using a full court room stage setting with judges and barristers all in their gowns and wigs, capturing the drama of the unfolding evidence and points of law. The audience surrounding the action felt very much part of the drama itself. After the verdict, we were then treated to an incredible plot twist... all was not as it first seemed! The journey home was fairly traffic laden but provided an opportunity for a coach tour of several London key tourist attractions and the opportunity to process all the action we had just witnessed.

Here are some student views of the day:

My experience of 'Witness for the Prosecution' was amazing. Being in County Hall provides a unique setting, enhancing the authenticity of the courtroom. The use of an actual courtroom setting adds to the atmosphere and immerses the audience in the action. The Criminology students found it helpful to understand how a courtroom operates, and the use of evidence and testimonies to convict people of crimes.

The immersive nature of the performance makes it a standout visit. The proximity to the actors and the realistic courtroom environment makes it an experience I will not forget. The members of the jury's decision-making process can be analysed in terms of social conformity (a topic in psychology). Social pressures and the presence of authoritative figures (like the judge) may well have influenced their verdict. Overall, I enjoyed the play and the way the audience is kept guessing right to the end.

'Witness for the prosecution' was a very interesting and quite shocking production. From the layout for the stage, to the plot twists and dramatic dialogue, it was amazing, and I am fortunate to have gone.

The layout was exactly like a court room which enabled us to have an inside feel of what it is like to be in one and it helped our criminology students to understand their course content in more depth. It linked nicely to our psychology course, especially the forensic part of the course, as it showed 'cognitive interview' approach used in police interrogation, and the fallibility of eye witness testimony which also demonstrated the memory section of our course.

It was a fantastic production and one that I would recommend for everyone to see!

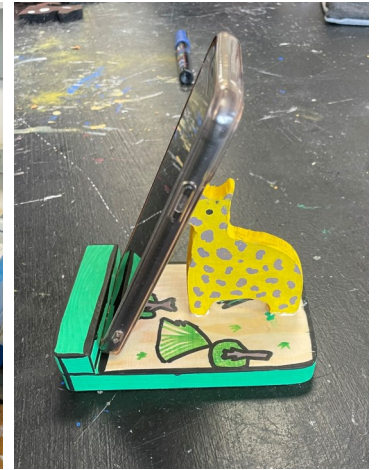


YEAR 10 CONSTRUCTION

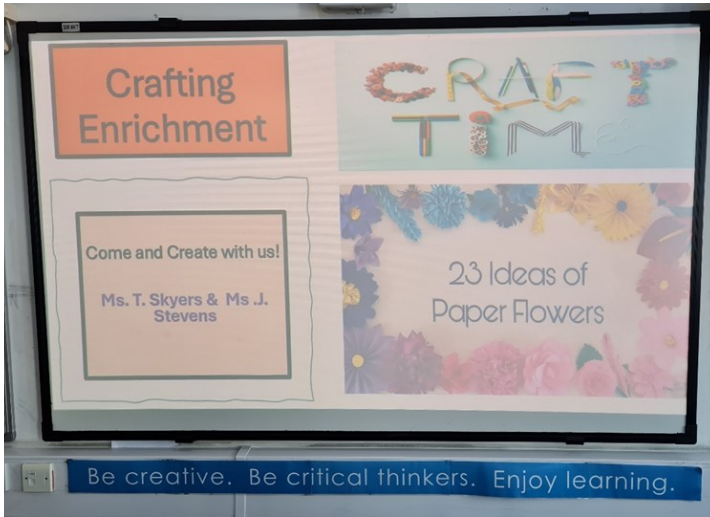

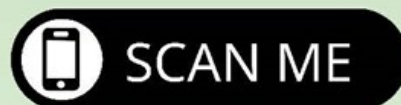
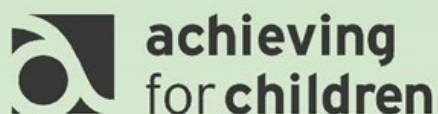
