YEAR 8 GEOGRAPHY AND SCIENCE MUSEUM VISIT



Destination: London Natural History Museum Tuesday 10th, Friday 13th and Monday 16th December 2023

Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to let you know about the Year 8 field trip to the Natural History Museum, London in mid-December 2024.

This field trip will be challenging, informative and engage students outside of their classroom environment. It will allow students to explore issues and questions in a realworld context that frequently produces uncertain or 'grey' outcomes that encourages them to question their own findings and nurtures analytical and critical thinking as well as building resilience. It is designed to enrich key parts of our KS3 curriculum that cannot easily be covered in the classroom. Whilst students are at the museum they will participate in a 'Biodiversity in Action' Workshop lead by scientists at the museum on the classification of various species, something which students also cover in school. This will develop their real work understanding of the curriculum and role of scientists in ecology.

This year the trip will run on three separate days. Your son/daughter will need to attend only one day. Each class and student will be informed which days he or she needs to attend, below are the class codes:

Tuesday 10th December 2024: 8f1, 8f2 & 8f3

Friday 13th December 2024: 8f4, 8p1 & 8p2

Monday 16th December 2024: 8p3, 8p4 & 8p5

We will be travelling to and from the location by private hire coach. The total cost of the field trip will be £20 including travel to and from the Natural History Museum. We ask that this be paid in full by Friday 6th December 2024.

Payment for the trip can be made via your ParentMail account no later than Friday 6th December 2024.

As with any school trip, good behaviour is important to its success. Parents and students should be aware that if a student's behaviour or attendance becomes unacceptable prior to the trip, then the school reserves the right to exclude them from the trip. This could in turn jeopardise any refund of money paid to that date.

Itinerary:

Meet by the main entrance to school at 8.45am, outside reception, in full school uniform, for a 9:00am departure. We will be taking a coach from Furze Platt directly to the Natural History Museum, London. We aim to return to school at 15.30pm.

Students will be required to wear school uniform.

Students will also need to bring a packed lunch, snacks, and a refillable water bottle to sustain them throughout the day. There will be no opportunity to get food at the Museum.

If you have questions in the meantime, please do get in touch as soon as possible.

Each year we need to train students on our Lockdown and Shelter Procedures. These are procedures that schools have in case of extremely unlikely eventualities like an intruder on site, a nearby chemical leak or a police incident near to the school. The purpose is to ensure students, staff and visitors are safe while the incident is dealt with.

Before the end of term, Tutors will be reminding students on how the procedure works and then we will practice this. Our aim is not to alarm you or your children but to ensure that we are all safe and know how to react in case of such unlikely eventualities. The purpose of this message is to let you know that this will be happening so that you are not unduly concerned should your child mention the training and drill.



CRIMINOLOGY CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT TALK FROM THE CHARITY DASH

Our Sixth Form Criminology students received a lecture from the Charity DASH about the crime of domestic abuse. Ben Kelly (Year 12) has written about this experience below.



Article about Criminology Talk


On Wednesday, all Criminology students were invited to a talk given by the DASH Charity. This charity provides specialist support to adults and children experiencing mental health issues, modern slavery, immigration, trafficking, homelessness and the range of complex needs associated with 'Domestic Abuse' ensuring their voices are heard.

Gabby provided an overview of what constitutes domestic abuse. She covered the statistics surrounding it, the issues involving the victims and perpetrators of domestic abuse and covered the impact of domestic abuse. She shared the DASH helplines, set up to help other people in the Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead struggling, together with other

organisations and their helplines that are available too. They also talked about unhealthy relationships and the common abuse resulting often in emotional and physiological scars.



Gaby effectively described the dangers of domestic abuse and what it can do to someone physically and emotionally. She encouraged people to ask for support if needed, such as using helplines and talking to trusted family and friends. Mrs Wright the Head of Criminology reminded students at the end of the talk about the school's safeguarding policy and that students could speak to any of their teachers if they have worries too.




Going through the reasons for the underreporting of this crime has helped criminology students at FPSS to understand some of the topics we have covered already and will cover in the Criminology diploma course. Gabby covered facts about domestic abuse and how to be able to identify when domestic abuse is occurring and the

barriers that prevent victims from reporting this crime to the police.

This is a very sensitive topic, but we appreciated greatly the work of this charity in providing us with more awareness.




MUSICAL THEATRE STAR




