YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

MON 23 - WED 25 JUNE 2025

Reminder that the deadline to add your placement to Unifrog is **Friday 4th April**. After this point, your placement may not be approved in time for Work Experience Week.



We are using Unifrog (www.unifrog.org) to manage the administration of the work experience programme – for example collecting information from the employer about their Risk Assessment and Health & Safety policy, as well as getting agreement from yourselves for the placement to go ahead.

Some important logistics:

- Students need to agree the placement with the employer first, and then students will get the ball rolling by adding the placement to their Unifrog account (they will find the Placements tool on their Unifrog homepage).
- The Unifrog system will then email the employer, the parent / guardian, and the school, to collect the necessary information and permissions. For the process to work, it is essential that students add the initial information about the placement accurately.

WORK EXPERIENCE —YEAR 10

A reminder of the upcoming deadline to apply for your child's Work Experience if they are in Year 10. The work experience will run for three days, from Monday 23rd June – Wednesday 25th June 2025.

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During this period all Year 10 students will be off site attending the workplace of their host employer. Students who do not secure an appropriate work experience placement will be expected in school on these dates for a bespoke programme. A reminder if below of how to apply. Please ensure your child has applied by the deadline of Friday 4th April 2025, after this point we cannot guarantee your child's placement will be approved in time for work experience week.

Students (and their families) should source their own work experience placements. We are usina (www.unifrog.org) to manage the administration of the work experience programme - for example collecting information from the employer about their Risk Assessment and Health & Safety policy, as well as getting agreement from yourselves for the placement to go ahead.

Some important logistics:

- Students need to agree the placement with the employer first, and then students will get the ball rolling by adding the placement to their Unifrog account (they will find the Placements tool on their Unifrog homepage).
- The Unifrog system will then email the employer, the parent / guardian, and the school, to collect the necessary information and permissions. For the process to work, it is essential that students add the initial information about the placement accurately.
- Safeguarding our pupils is of the upmost importance. For this reason, work experience will not be approved in placements where there is only one employee. Students should be in a placement where there are multiple adults present at all times. The school holds the final right to approve or decline a work experience placement and may do so if a placement is felt to not meet the safeguarding, health and safety, liability insurance or educational needs of a young person. The school will inform parents/carers if they feel it is necessary to share any Special Educational Needs or Safeguarding information with an employer, in order to ensure a child's needs can be met.
- Pupils will receive training on safeguarding themselves whilst in placement, along with how to get the most out of their work experience, expectations etc.

Finding out more:

Unifrog have created a set of guides about placements which you can find here.

Within this set of guides, this is the best one to start with (it includes a short animation of how the whole process works).

Next we recommend looking at this one, because it includes advice on how to find a placement.

We will deliver training to students on using Unifrog. Students may wish to wait until this training has happened, before submitting their application.






