LAMDA LESSONS AT FURZE PLATT SCHOOL



I am very excited to announce that we have some spaces for 3 new students for Lamda lessons after February half term. These will run in a similar way to Music Peripatetic lessons; weekly lessons where students will come out of lessons on a rotated basis for a 30minute Lamda lesson. There is the offer of solo, paired or group sessions.

What is Lamda?

Lamda is one of the UK's oldest and most respected London Drama Schools and awarding bodies. Lamda have been offering practical exams in communication & performance subjects for over 130 years.

Lamda qualifications are graded. The graded system begins at Entry Level up to Medal Level (Grades 6-8). Medal levels also have UCAS points. Lamda exams are about achievement, recognising and rewarding success and developing vital life skills for every individual.

Lamda offers a range of courses, but the most popular courses are Verse and Prose, Public Speaking, Acting and Musical Theatre.

How will Lamda lessons run at Furze Platt?

Our Lamda teacher is called Jane Trainer (see full biography on page 3). She will be offering 30 minute lessons to students on a Friday. These can be a solo lesson, paired lessons or a group lesson (up to 4 students). In lessons, depending on the chosen course, students will choose their performance pieces or public speaking topic and Jane will coach and direct them with their performances. There is also theoretical aspect to the qualification which will extend their analytical skills and understanding of Dramatic theory. Students will then take an examination in the grade before moving up to the next grade.

What is the cost?

Jane is a highly experience and well qualified Lamda teacher who has taught at a range of schools which you can see from her biography. The cost of her lessons are:

Solo lessons-£24 per 30mins

Paired lessons-£16 per student per 30 mins

Groups (max 4) £15 per student per 30 mins

If you are a Pupil Premium student, then your lessons can be partly subsidised by the school. Please contact Mrs Kalinowski for more information.

She is proud that many of her students are members of the National Youth Theatre and in full time training at drama schools including Bristol Old Vic, Royal Central, Arts Educational, GSA, Juilliard and Berklee in the US and that many are now performing professionally in the industry.

Jane has sat on the RADA audition panel, has taught at Cambridge University preparing students for drama school auditions and coaches young people for drama scholarships, interviews & auditions. Jane is Artistic Director of LifeStage and District64, with specialist acting classes across Bucks and Berks.

Jane is absolutely passionate about working with young people in developing their acting and performing arts skills, helping them to build confidence, communication skills, a love of theatre and a myriad of essential transferable life skills, which come through working on the LAMDA syllabus and examination process.

WEDNESDAY ART CLUB



On Tuesday and Wednesday this week our Year 8 students enjoyed a workshop given by the Heathrow World of Work group.














GARDENING CLUB

COOKING UP A TREAT


We had a delicious start to the today in the Food Tech room with our Year 9 students! Amazing aromas and impressive food preparation skills on display.




FRIDAY CRAFTSMANSHIP



Year 13

In Amelia's work, she explores the works of artists Dana Ellyn and Charles Willson Peale to understand the concept of the animal saviour complex and how it relates to animal cruelty and justice. She examines how animals have been perceived in religion and culture, particularly the societal beliefs that rank animals as superior or inferior. Amelia chooses these artists because of their contrasting approaches to the theme of animal cruelty, with Ellyn's modern, confrontational style challenging viewers' moral views on animal rights, and Peale's traditional, tone-driven works, like Noah and His Ark, highlighting the human desire to dominate and classify animals. This study influences Amelia's own art, inspiring her to experiment with Ellyn's thought-provoking compositions and Peale's tone contrasts. Overall, her research provides valuable insights into how different artistic styles and historical contexts address animal cruelty, while also prompting further questions that deepen her understanding of the complex human-animal relationship.
